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# THE OEF DURING 1998

The Open Estonia Foundation is a benevolent non-governmental foundation operating in the public interest. It was established on April 19, 1990 at the initiative of and with the support of the well-known US financier and philanthropist George Soros. George Soros himself says in an Estonian language version this year – that back in those days, the task of the Open Society Foundations was to help shut-off societies become more open, to thereafter increase the viability of open societies, and also to contribute to the development of critical thought.

The phrases that sum up 1998 in a nutshell are cooperation and partnership. Cooperation is best illustrated by the fact that numerous other organizations lent their support to OEF projects. The OEF ethnic relations megaprojects serves as a good example, which received a total of 5,4 million crowns from the Open Estonia Foundation, the Foundation for the Integration of non-Estonians, the Phare Program of the European Union, and the Nordic Countries/UNDP. We also launched – as an undertaking of the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and George Soros' Open Society Institute – the Baltic-American Partnership Fund for the support of civil society and democracy, which will channel 15 million dollars of funding to the three Baltic countries during a period of ten Years.

It also needs to be noted that the list of activities that the OEF is engaged in has grown in length. Illustrative of the extent of the scope of the activities of Foundation is the fact that we are participating in tens of programs that have been activated within the framework of the Foundations for the support of Open Society, encompassing a broad variety of concerns that range from nursery schools to human rights to national health issues. It needs to be added that in this respect, the greatest amount of attention is being paid to problems regarded as critical, such as ethnics relations, the integration of the socially marginalized, and the development of civil society.

1998 was a year to be noted in one more regard, in that on the occasion of the 80th anniversary of the founding of the Estonian State, President of Estonia Lennart Meri bestowed the Maarjamaa Cross of the First Order upon the founder of the Open Estonia Foundation and the defender of the values of an open society, George Soros.

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Strategy was the key word in the lexicon of the Open Estonia Foundation in 1998. The shaping of a new strategy was undertaken, with the knowledge that the financial support of George Soros is inevitably going to diminish in the years to come. The aim of our institution is to become a foundation that a variety of different donors will underwrite. The first steps in this direction have been taken. The fund is already involved as a middleman, finding worthy recipients for the support being provided by the Baltic American Partnership Fund, and the first individual donors have appeared on the stage, having made the decision to avail themselves of the expertise and experience of the Open Estonia Foundation in helping them to ensure that their contributions find worthy recipients. Since the OEF is without a doubt one of the most professional institutions in Eastern Europe to be involved in the distribution of funds, it is our hope that the list of our sponsors will continue to grow in the near future.

Last year the nature of the work of the Open Estonia Foundation also changed. We no longer accept applications on the basis of competitions that are only limited by the imagination of the applicant. Now, applications are only accepted if they meet the criteria established by the theme-oriented competitions that the Foundation announces. This has had two effects. The activities that the Foundation is involved in now have to fit into a narrower range of focuses, and the adoption of this practice places greater responsibility on the people who conceptualize and execute the competitions. In addition to having to be competent in the skills of distributing support, this means that the OEF is having to function more and more in the role of a think tank. This role continues to grow in importance, for it is where the ideas for shaping the foundation itself will be coming from in the near future, not to mention the pinpointing of the issues, spheres and problems that the OEF must involve itself in, if the support that it provides is to prove to be of substance and truly results-oriented for Estonia. It should be self-apparent that this last objective can only be attained if the many friends and intellectual partners off the OEF act in concert with us!

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# EDUCATION

## **Institutional Support earmarked for the School of Distinction Development Center**

The School of Distinction Development Center was established in 1997, with the aim of coordinating the activities and the development of the projects on the drawing board of the Schools of Distinction Association. The Schools of Distinction Development Center seeks support for projects from private funds as well as from state and local authorities. The Schools of Distinction Development Center also arranges training for participants in projects, acts as a go-between for educational consultants, and publishes materials that focus on development of schools and the education of teachers.

## **Training Centers for Supplementary Schooling of Teachers**

A network of project centers for the schooling of teachers is being created as a joint project of the Schools of Distinction Development Center and the Faculty of Educational Sciences of the Tallinn Pedagogical University. The project centers are being set up in schools that are involved in the execution of the programs of the Open Estonia Foundation for the education of teachers (High School 32 in Tallinn, The Raatus High School in Tartu, the Kreutzwald High School in Võru, The United High School of Saaremaa).

## **Quality Management Systems in Estonian Schools**

40 pilot schools throughout Estonia are involved in the Quality School of the Estonian School project. Quality system modules are being worked out and put into practice, and the system for internal and external evaluation is being modernized. The quality systems being worked out in the pilot schools participating in the project are intended for use in all of the schools in Estonia. Descriptions of the systems are to be published in the journals of the Ministry of Education.

### **The Working Group of the Quality Mangement System Estonian School**

The working group of the Quality School of the Estonian schools is made up of representatives of the Chair of Quality Technology of the Tallinn Technical University, the Schools of Distinction Association, the Ministry of Education, The Pedagogical University, The State Center for Testing and Qualification, and representatives of local governments. The working group for the Quality School of Estonian Schools has been tasked with working out a quality assurance concept for Estonia's schools, as well as the basis for structuring and grading the quality systems to be used by schools, and is also working on assembling the curricula for quality schooling that will be used by teams and consultants working in schools.

### **The Rights of the Learner**

Seminars and meetings for activists involved in student government were held under the aegis of The Union of Students Councils in order to discuss issues pertaining to the rights and responsibilities of students. During the Information Fair "Teeviit" (Signpost) held in February of 1998, a demonstration debate was held on the subject of "The rights of the learner", and an educational film by the same name was made, in order to provide information about the guiding principles behind student governments and their goals.

### **Arrangement of a Course on Learning Skills**

The course "Creating Myself as I Study" is based on the principle that a student's abilities need to be developed. This enables adequate and goal-oriented analysis, as well as the prioritization of one's educational activities. 24 teachers from various schools throughout Estonia attended the course.

#### **"The Institute of the Open Mind"**

An introductory film about an organization which offers innovative and alternative methodologies for the supplementary training of teachers in the Estonian educational system.

### **Educational Forum in the Internet**

At the initiative of the Educational Expert Council of the educational program of the OEF and the Development Center of the School of Distinction, a chat line was opened in the Internet for the purpose of discussing the future evolution of education in Estonia. In addition to teachers and the managing staff of schools, the third sector is also involved in the debate on this theme, in the form of representatives of parents, employers and other organizations.

### **"Switch it on!"**

Instruction aimed at teachers in Saaremaa, which was designed to teach the use of various technical devices and visual aids for the purpose of providing lessons with more content.

The coordination of higher education programs of the OEF and the working out and initiation of new projects by the Center for Educational Technology of the Tallinn Pedagogical Institute, and the documentation of higher education projects and social education projects for the Estonian Data Archive of Social Sciences (ESTA).

### **The Narva Information Fair "Landmark"**

An event designed with the young people of Ida Virumaa in mind, which had the objective of making available a broad variety of information about the problems of youngsters.

A series of articles called "Multiethnic and Multilingual Estonian Schools" appeared in "Haridus". The articles deal with the reform process in schools that are based on languages other than Estonian, and with other thorny issues that pertain to the integration of non-Estonian youngsters into Estonian society and the Estonian culture.

A stipend to support Valeria Sizemskaja, senior in the Narva Pähklikimäe High School, in her independent preparations for the International Chemistry Championships.

**EEK 35,000**

**A Development Project for the Schools of Northeastern Estonia**

A project designed to assist in the development of the schools and curricula of Ida-Virumaa, where the Internet was used as the medium for the advancement of cooperation between the schools.

**Scenarios for Education in Estonia for the year 2015**

A public debate about the future of Estonian education up to the year 2015 was launched, with internationally known experts enlisted in the creation of the scenarios. These scenarios are being published in the mass media and the Internet.

**Shaping of Greater Awareness as concerns the Environment**

The Tallinn Botanical Gardens are used as a learning base for general education schools to help to create a greater awareness of the environment in students, and also for the purpose of modernizing the schooling that is given on the subjects of natural and environmental sciences. In cooperation with teachers, education of this sort will be modernized, better illustrated and enlivened.

**The Environmental Education Project "Heredity"**

Schoolchildren learn about hereditary association, the basic principles of nature conservation, and the importance of natural diversity with the help of the Internet and through the use of active educational methods.

**The Kuri Village School – Carrier of Education and Culture for the Surrounding Area**

Technical equipment and materials at the school were upgraded, which helps ensure that the schoolchildren get a better level of quality in their education, and also contributes to an improved cultural life and extracurricular forms of association in the villages.

**The Science Interest Center "Ahhaa"**

The Science Interest Center project was founded in Autumn 1997 by Tartu University. This is a modern interactive museum, where visitors get a better feel for ideas and concepts through personalized experiences and by having hands-on access to the exhibits. The Science Interest Center is similar to the Finnish "Eureka" Interest Center. The Open Estonia Foundation helped the Interest Center by providing it with a copying devices and a video system.

**An English-Estonian Dictionary of Idioms**

The compilation of the index for an English-Estonian idiomatic dictionary, which is the last step involved in putting together this substantial reference work (1,070 pp.).

**Software for Computer Classes**

Software packages acquired for the Mathematics Department of Tartu University, which were needed for supplementary vocational training of teachers of mathematics and information sciences. The software is also used for educational purposes in the Chair of Physics and Chemistry.

**Development of Model Curricula**

Development and publication of curricula for general education schools. Curricula for the 1st, 4th, 7th and 10th grades were revised and subject

matter for the 2nd, 5th, 8th and 11th grades was worked out.

### **Conflict and Communication**

In this project - incepted in 1997 - a curriculum was worked out for teaching the skills involved in solving conflicts in schools. During 1998, the primary emphasis was on teaching teachers in this subject area.

### **Freedom in Education**

Winter and summer seminars in the Teacher's Supplementary Education Project. The theme of the winter seminar was "Painting and a Person's Lifetime". The theme of the winter seminar was "The Word and the Message".

### **The Fourth Conference of Baltic University Students**

60 students of sociology, political science and economics from various Estonian, Latvian and Lithuanian institutions of higher learning took part of the annual conference of the Civic Education Project, held in March in Vilnius.

### **Summer Course for Teachers of English**

An intensive course in language and methodology for 75 teachers from Estonian and Russian language schools who are requalifying to become teachers of English.

### **Crises that Occur in Schools and their Prevention**

A competition was held for students, who gathered case studies about crises that occur in schools. An anthology of descriptions of crises that have occurred in schools was published, with commentaries.

### **Formal Grammars and their Applications**

A summer school in Tartu from August 23 to September 5 for students from the Baltic countries, Central and Eastern Europe who specialize in computer linguistics.

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### **Information Center for European Studies**

The center provides information about possibilities for study in Europe, administers and organizes an information base, provides counseling for those in need of information, and arranges instruction for users of these services.

### **Special Education Course for Teachers who work at Hospitals**

A course for teachers who work at hospitals, sanitariums, and special schools designed to provide supplementary educational skills for those who work with children having behavioral problems.

### **A Workbook entitled "Read and Draw"**

An exercise book designed to better the speaking skills of deaf and hearing-impaired children, as well as children with speech defects. The primary objective of the book is to teach children to comprehend what they are reading.

### **Phenological Observations for Children**

Under the aegis of the TELO Interest Center, Estonian students participate alongside students of other Baltic Sea countries in monitoring seasonal changes in the natural environment, and engage in the exchange of information gathered through observation.

Translation of the KAUFMAN ABC method of evaluating the level of development of preschool children and children in their first years in school.

**Conference: "25 Years Since the Birth of Cultural Semiotics"**

The international conference was dedicated to one of the most notable publications of the Tartu-Moscow school – "Theses of Cultural Semiotics" (1973), which is regarded by the scientific world as the year that the semiotics of culture was born as a scientific discipline.

**The Role of the Pictorial Arts in the Development of  
Independent Thinkers**

The "Visual Thinking Strategies" program is based on research that has been going on for 20 years, and relies upon the development of thinking ability and experience in communications through the observation of works of art. In 1997 Estonia started her participation in a three year program which entails giving supplementary schooling to primary school teachers. This for the purpose of using works of art as a means of bettering the observation and communications skills of children, and also as an aid in helping them to learn to think.

**Reading and Writing for Critical Thinking**

The International Reading Society has worked out and is administering this 3-year program. 65 teachers from Estonian and Russian language schools in Estonia are taking part of the project. They have all completed a training course involving active methods. In the next phase of the project, those who have received this supplementary schooling will themselves begin work as instructors.

**Vocational Guidance Program**

Young people receive information and counseling about careers in a Career Center which was established as a result of an OEF initiative. The Center also works with teachers in the area of vocational guidance. In 1998, a

collection of educational articles entitled "A Career Guide" was compiled and published. During the period of May 8 to May 10, the Career Center arranged a seminar entitled "Vocational Guidance: the Current Situation and Future Scenarios in a Comparative Perspective".

### **Debate Program**

The Estonian Debating Movement got its start in 1994 at the initiative of the OEF. The aims of the debating movement are: promotion of the art of debating, the development of critical thought and the skills of communication and presentation. The Estonia Debating Society - founded in 1995 due to an initiative of the OEF - coordinates the preparation and arranging of debates for students and university students, promotes the adoption of various styles of debating (Karl Popper debates, parliamentary debate, "Mock Trial" and *ex tempore*) and arranges training and seminars on debating, as well as educational seminars.

### **The Fundamentals of Legal Information (Street Law)**

The compiling of educational materials pertaining to jurisprudence and the conduct of a practical course in the field of law in institutions of higher learning

### **I\*EARN**

I\*EARN is an international organization of computerized study projects. Teachers in Estonia joined it in Autumn of 1996. Students in Estonian schools participated in international learning projects with tutoring by teachers during the years 1997 and 1998.

### **Step by Step**

The educational reform program "Step by Step" is intended for children who are ten years old or younger. The program emphasizes the importance of teaching methods that are individualized and that place the personality of the child first, but that also entail getting the family and those in the immediate social environment of the child involved in the learning process. A significant part of the activities of the program are aimed at providing additional training for teachers and other educators of the children. By the end of 1998, 164 groups from 85 institutions of

learning had united with the program, with a total involvement of 3,446 children.

### **Big Brother/Big Sister**

The Children's Support Centers in Tartu and Tallinn help to shape a positive view of the world and provide supportive relationships for children who have been denied parental care. In order to help the children, relationships based on friendship are created between children and adults who have elected to provided support.

### **Program for the Prevention of Child Abuse**

The OEF has provided support to the activities of the Children's Support Center in Tartu and the Children's Support Center in Tallinn within the framework of this program. The most important undertaking in 1998 was the regional training arranged in Põlva for pediatricians under the rubric "The Role of the Pediatrician in Helping the Abused Child" and training provided in Tartu by specialists from England and Northern Ireland to pediatricians, police and social workers who come into contact with abused children in the course of their work.

A textbook compiled by a group of faculty members of the Children's Research Center of Yale University in the USA regarding cooperation between police and social workers, psychologists and physicians entitled "Cooperation between the Police and Specialists of Mental Health. Social Responsibility for Urban Violence".

Tallinn, September 22

# SUPPORT PROGRAM FOR HIGHER EDUCATION

## **Public Competition**

### **“ MODERNIZATION OF DEGREE STUDIES AND TEACHING AIDS BASED ON CONTEMPORARY TECHNOLOGY ”**

#### **Estonian Folklore in the Internet**

Continuation of the publication (begun in 1997) of materials pertaining to the folklore and religious beliefs of Estonians and other Finno-Ugric peoples in the Internet. Materials that have received the final touch will be recorded on a CD.

#### **The Modernization of Basic and Supplementary Training in the Field of Special Educational Sciences**

Modernization of the teaching of special educational sciences was begun at Tartu University, The Tallinn Pedagogical University and the Narva Higher Education Institute in 1997. This involves the compiling and translation of educational literature, the production of educational films, and the creation of a customized computer education program.

#### **EstSat**

Tests are being conducted on the basis of models used internationally for students who apply to be admitted to Estonian institutions of higher learning.

#### ***Projectum Studiorum Hungaricorum in Estoniae***

Six teaching aids for students of the Hungarian Language and Culture at Tartu University. These materials are also suitable for use within the context of the Open University and other forms of language study. A comprehensive Hungarian-Estonian database is being assembled, which can be accessed on disk and the Internet.

### **The Development of Master's Degree Programs in Public Administration at Tartu University**

The aim of the project is to create the conditions necessary for persons studying in the Masters program in Public Administration to be able to go on to be motivated and qualified lecturers and scientific workers. Ten courses of study in the specialty field of public administration are being developed, and the infrastructure that is necessary for the most vital of working conditions for lecturers and Master's Degree graduate students is being created.

### **Western Philosophy**

The working out of a basic course on the primary ideas of Western Civilization through the joint efforts of faculty members of Tartu University and Columbia University, designed for undergraduate students and students studying for a Master's degree. Educational activities were arranged for the lecturers of Tartu University.

### **An Electronic Educational Aid for the Teaching of Formal Traditional Logic**

An educational package consisting of a textbook and programs of practice exercises and exams is meant for university students enrolled in social sciences courses and the humanities.

### **The Development of Archeological Studies at Tartu University**

The electronic supplement "Estonian Archeological Studies" is being put together for the "Ancient Estonia" lecture course. The course material on archeology is being improved, and courses of study for both a Master's Degree and a Doctorate are being worked out.

### **Aid for Learning Folk Songs**

The project involves the modernization and diversification of the teaching of folk songs at Tartu University. An electronic study aid called "Poetics of Estonian Folk Songs" is being put together, and a collection of the styles of folk music of the world is under construction.

**A Teaching Aid for Reading and Specialty Literature for the Department of Educational Sciences of Tartu University**

An electronic teaching aid is being put together for students of the social sciences and humanities, which includes methods to assist in reading more effectively, exercises for the learning of those methods, and tests designed to check the effectiveness of reading.

**Preparations for a Course about the History of Understanding the World**

This entails compiling a textbook called "A History of Understanding the World" for universities and other schools of higher learning, and the creation of an interactive home page for university students specializing in social sciences and the humanities.

**The Inclusion of the Estonian Data Archive of Social Sciences in the Teaching of the Social Sciences in Estonian universities**

The program involves modernizing social sciences courses with the involvement of the Estonian Data Archive of Social Sciences. This is being done at the Bachelor's, Masters and Doctorate levels. New hardware and software will be acquired. Existing courses on the social sciences will be updated, and an electronic journal is being created which will publish social science research materials about the transformation of Estonian society.

**Art Styles**

The project involves the preparation of the technical aids (transparencies and disks) needed for the course on art styles. The course deals with art history on various levels, categorized by styles of art. The course will get underway at Tartu University in 1999.

**Reform of German Linguistics Curriculum**

The point of the reform is to make the curriculum of the course of study of German Linguistics at Tartu University more flexible, offering more electoral courses. The reform will enable students to intensively engage in a narrower field of research, and will give faculty the opportunity to

focus more on scientific work.

**EEK 50,000**

### **Modernization of Degree Studies at the Department of Philosophy of Tartu University**

Graduate students (both Master's Degree and Ph.D.) enrolled in the area of philosophy at Tartu University will be enabled to have access to contemporary databases. Specialty literature will also be procured.

### **European Journalism Teaching Aids**

The textbook being published is intended for media students. The book will deal with the development of the media in Europe from the year 1945 onwards, focusing on general trends in the development of the media, and will contain comparative descriptions of the journalism of various European countries.

### **Modernization of Estonian Literature and Theater Studies**

The infrastructure of the Chair of Literature at Tartu University will be renewed, in order to ensure that degree studies meet contemporary requirements.

### **Strategic Painting**

Newer technological methods (video and photography) will be utilized in the methods employed in the "Strategic Painting" course, this in addition to the traditional means of teaching painting. The objective of the project is to procure the technical devices needed to conduct the course.

### **Updating Master's Degree Studies in Germanic-Romance Linguistics**

The creation of an IT environment at the Department of Germanic-Romance Linguistics at the Tallinn Pedagogical University, which will permit the substantial modernization of graduate studies – both for the Master's degree and the Ph.D. Needed equipment will be procured, and teaching and instructional materials will be prepared.

### **Computer System for the Teaching of Sociology**

The creation of an IT-based teaching system at the Tallinn Pedagogical University which will make study materials in the discipline of sociology available on magnetic storage systems. The required technical devices will be procured, and both study and teaching materials will be prepared.

### **Development Project for the Tallinn Philosophy Center**

The creation of a Study and Scientific Center for joint use by the institutions of higher learning in Tallinn, for the purpose of bringing greater order to the educational systems of the capital city and in the interests of developing an optimal academic structure.

### **The "Pathfinder" Database**

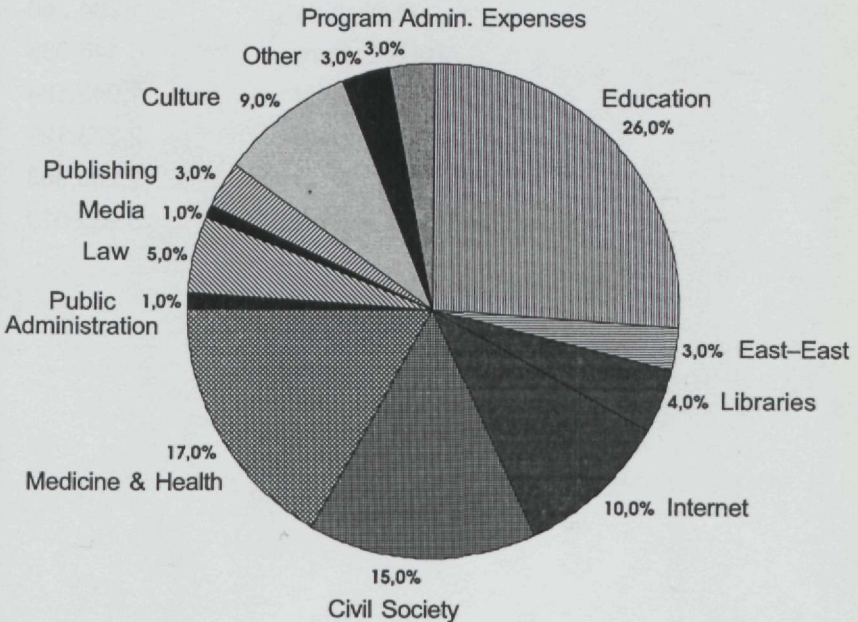
